

Appendix No. 2: List of Allowable Tolerances
Sales Terms and Conditions of SALE s.r.o.

Allowable tolerances on thickness and size of Goods:

- $\pm(3\% + 2 \text{ microns})$ for the thickness of films made of BOPP and CPP
- $\pm(6\% + 3 \text{ microns})$ for the thickness of films made of HDPE, MDPE, LDPE, PLA or plastic mixtures
- $\pm 5\%$ for weight per one meter of paper
- $\pm(9\% + 9 \text{ microns})$ for the thickness of films made or recycled materials

Allowable tolerances on linear dimensions of Goods:

- $\pm 0.3 \text{ cm}$ for the size of Goods made of BOPP or CPP
- $\pm 0.5 \text{ cm}$ for the size of Goods made of paper
- $\pm 0.8 \text{ cm}$ for the size of goods made of HDPE, MDPE, LDPE, PLA or plastic mixtures
- $\pm 1.2 \text{ cm}$ for positions of handles, holes, etc.

Allowable tolerances in flexographic printing colour mix:

- $\pm 0.1 \text{ cm}$ for photographic quality flexographic printing
- $\pm 0.3 \text{ cm}$ for graphic quality flexographic printing

Tolerances may be doubled if the goods are made of the following materials:

- HDPE or MDPE with a thickness of less than 16 microns
- LDPE, TRIOLEN, PLA with a thickness of less than 31 microns
- CPP or BOPP with a thickness of less than 21 microns

For goods made of LEATHER, ARTIFICIAL LEATHER, NYLON, PAPER, LLDPE, POLYESTER, NEOPRENE, AL, ALU, EPE, OPP, SPANDEX, FILC, EVA, PP the length (width, height) production tolerance is $\pm 2.5\%$.

Allowable tolerances on colours:

- $\Delta E^*_{\text{Lab}} = 4$ for print colours, these differences may be larger if the base is not white
- $\Delta E^*_{\text{Lab}} = 8$ for material colours (plastic, paper, etc.)

Any deviations in size, thickness, printing, etc. beyond the above will be considered as a defect in the Goods only if at least 3% of the Goods have such deviations.

Quantity tolerances:

The quantity tolerance is $\pm 10\%$. The Buyer shall pay the purchase price for the quantity of Goods actually delivered. In case of delivery of a smaller quantity of Goods (within a tolerance of 10%), the Buyer is not entitled to demand delivery of the remaining quantity of Goods. In the event of delivery of a larger quantity of Goods (within a tolerance of 10%), the Buyer shall be obliged to pay for this quantity.
